Sweetgrass Braids

Sweetgrass (Hierochloa Odorata) has many ceremonial uses among most Indian tribes and is often used in conjunction with sage. Its smoke is used for prayer, cleansing and as a healing agent. Sage is first burned to drive away any negative forces, then sweetgrass is burned to summon positive ones. It is frequently used in Sweat Lodge ceremonies, tied to traditional bustles and used as a sachet for clothing. Sometimes known as Marsh Hay, and in Lakota it is called Sink'pe tawota.

Colonial Gaiters

Gaiters were a constant in colonial military or frontier dress. Introduced in 1701 during the Queen Anne's War, they became more essential during the French and Indian War when frontier campaigns and exposure to Native Americans tribes became more prevalent. The book Daily Life of the Old Colonial Frontier describes the private soldier during this time as wearing (among other things) "...one pair of gaiters made of canvass, one water-resistant pair made of linen canvass and blackened with tar, and one pair of black woolen cloth". Our gaiters are made from wool and measure 24" long and enclosed on the outer edge by white bone buttons.

Brass & Copper Lanterns

Brass and copper lanterns were also prevalent throughout the 18th and early 19th century. We offer two styles in brass. The barn lantern is the larger of the two measuring 15" tall, 6.5" wide, and 4.5" deep. It has glass panels on three sides with one side hinged for candle replacement. The back panel is brass and has holes for hanging. The traveling lantern is smaller (10"x4.5") but has the same panel configuration. It does, however, have a chimney or smoke hole on the top. Our copper lantern is made from a solid copper sheet and measures 15.5" tall x 6" wide. It has a four panel glass enclosure, and one of these sides has a hinge for easy candle replacement. Candle holder has a 1" diameter setting and can accommodate 6" and 8" candles.

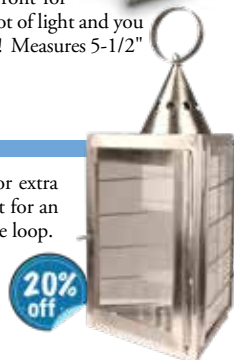

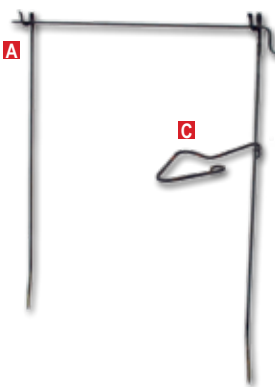
